Village President Update

One of the primary functions of our village government is to plan for the future. We see planning having the potential to give us greater control over the events that will effect our future. Most of our influences impacting our decisions evolve from financial, marketing, policy or operating developments. Here are some examples of our long term planning:

WEB SITE The village will have its own web site within the next few months. We hope to share it with other community groups and utilize it for marketing, directory, bulletin and other information purposes. We worked on this for three years and it is included in the 2001 budget.

NEW COMMUNICATION ANTENNA People in our fire, police and rescue departments have planned for 15 years to improve electronic sending and receiving messages throughout the county. Manitowoc County will pay 100 percent for and install a new communication antenna on our water tower as soon as weather permits. The new unit will

improve the integrity and quality of messages.

NORTH AVENUE (COUNTY XX) UPGRADING Village officials recently met with Gary Kennedy, the County Road Commissioner and discussed the future of North Avenue; specifically the roadway east of I-43 to Dairyland Drive. The traffic on this road has increased

dramatically and counts are projected to reach 8,000 vehicles per day by the year 2005. This road needs to be studied for safety, commercial development, and right of ways, Westview access, general traffic patterns, etc. The project would be funded approximately 95 percent state, federal, county and 5 percent village. The planning process of study, design and construction will take about five years. Currently, we are told this is the heaviest traveled county trunk in our county.

POLICE COMMISSION Five Cleveland citizens were approved by the village board to serve staggered terms from 1-5 years. They are: Ron Hansmann, Tammy Serketich, Joe Leonard, Cynthia Roeck and Ann Albright.

The police commission is defined by Wisconsin state statute 62.13 (1) and has the duties of hiring, promoting, disciplining, hearing appeals and firing police officers. The Public Safety Commission has been working to establish this for the past 18 months.

The initial formation and orientation meeting was on February 8, 2001 at 7 p.m. at the village hall. All police commission meetings are open to the public and posted notice of date and time will be given in advance.

JEAN LOICHTINGER RETIRES A special recognition award goes to Village Trustee Jean Loichinger, who also served as our Commissioner of the Weed Program. Jean was our environmental steward for Parks and Recreation. During her terms of service she was instrumental in founding the Bouda Platform, Tree City USA, Multiple grants and the Reforestation Program. Her contributions and dedication are a beautiful example of unselfish caring and citizenship! Jean and her husband, Fred, will be moving to Madison to be closer to their family. Best wishes and thank you, Jean!

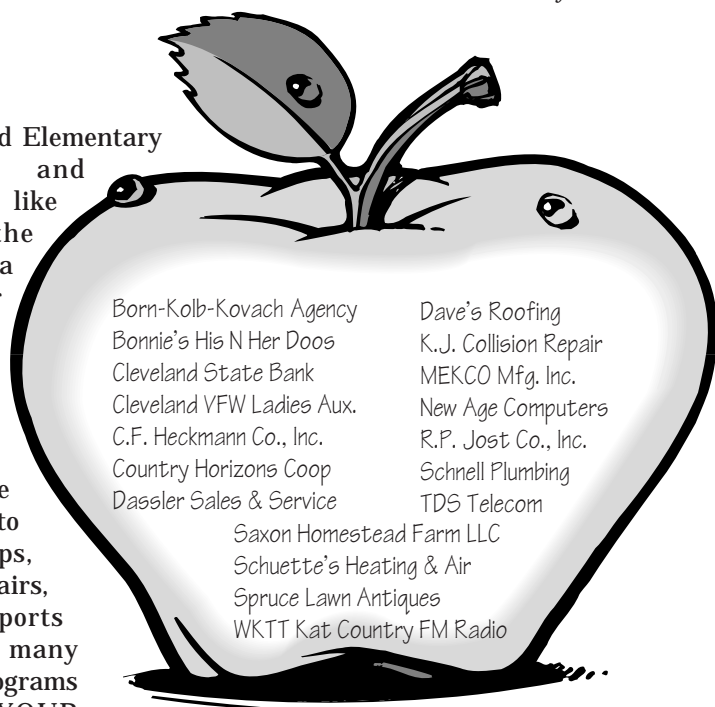
The Kids Holiday Shoppe was a huge success again. Everyone including Santa had a great time.

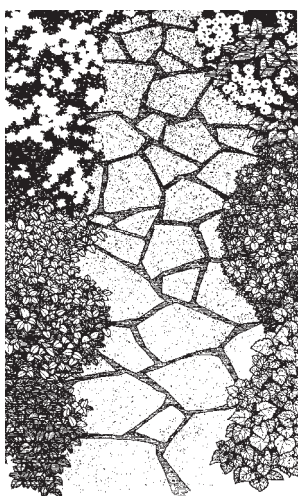
East Wind Garden Club News

There are a number of new perennials on the market this year. Here are a few roses just to mention a few. 'Brilliant Pink Iceberg' a sport of the beautiful white 'Iceberg.' It's every bit as reliable as its parent, but with beautiful new color. This reaches four to five feet tall and wide. Rose 'Long Tall Sally,' this rose has hydrangea type flowers in a buff white color. This plant will reach six to eight feet tall and five feet wide.

These are both beautiful roses but I'm putting my money on 'Climbing Autumn Sunset.' It gets eight to twelve feet tall and three to five feet wide. This beauty has a sweet, fruity fragrance, is very resistant to black spot and is a honey apricot color.

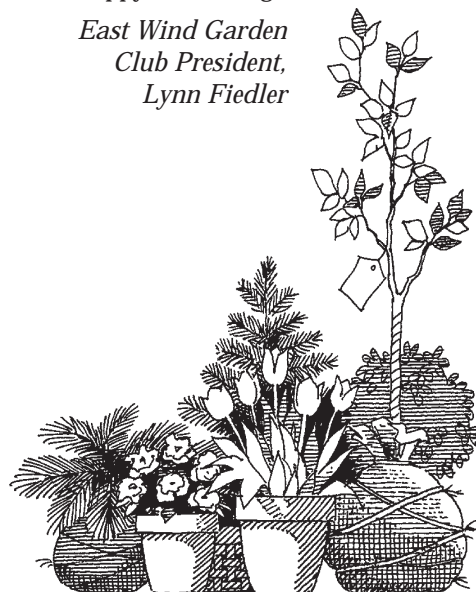
One last thought. If there is anyone out there that would like to help the garden club the day of our garden walk, please let me know. It takes a lot of

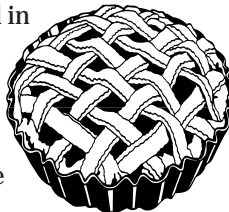

Ticket prices for the chili dinner are: Adults. \$3.50; Children 6-12, \$2; children under five are free. Hotdogs and carryouts are available.

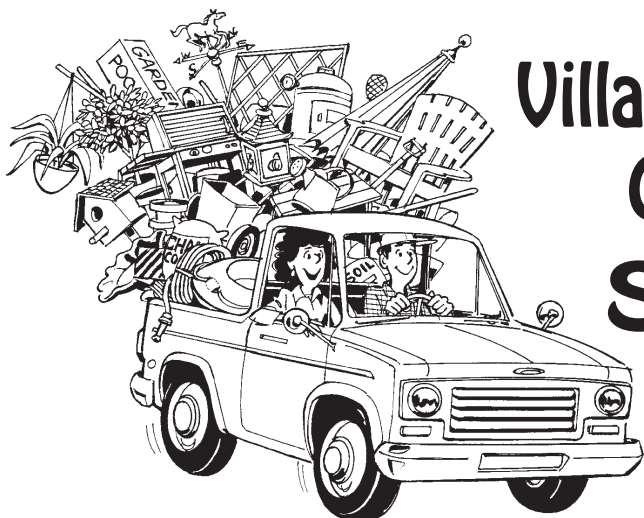

Things at LTC have been very busy over the past few months! One of the most noticeable projects has been the ongoing implementation of the new Administrative Systems Software (PeopleSoft). This ongoing project is expected to be completed in June, 2003. Enrollments at LTC total 1,950 FTEs (full time enrolled) with a 20,000 unduplicated headcount for 1999-2000. Additionally, year-to-date enrollment shows that the college will have an estimated increase of 2 percent for 2000-2001.

In November, LTC was honored by Governor Tommy Thompson as a recipient of the prestigious Wisconsin Forward Award-Mastery Level. This was a great honor and a wonderful achievement for the whole college.

We continue to reach out to the Lakeshore community through a variety of methods. Recently, LTC partnered with the Manitowoc/Two Rivers and Sheboygan Chamber of Commerces, as well as the UW Centers in Manitowoc and Sheboygan, Lakeland College and Silver Lake College to form the Chamber/College Alliance. It is the hopes that this alliance will show that the Lakeshore area is a great place

to live, work, play and go to school

Another partnership includes a Health Care Alliance that has been formed in the Lakeshore area. Recently, LTC invited representatives from various health care facilities in Manitowoc and Sheboygan counties to address many issues, including the labor shortage and different types of training for employees in the health care field. It is my hope that these cooperations will prove to be beneficial to the Lakeshore area. From all indications, 2001 is off to a great start!
